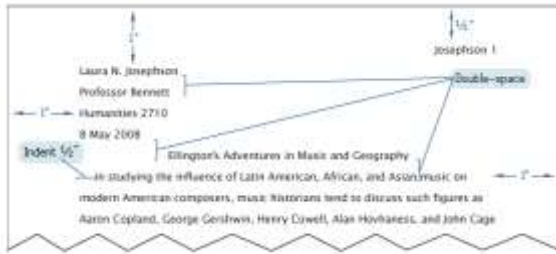


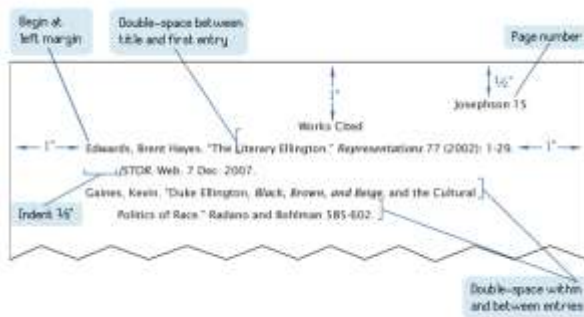
## First Page of Paper:



## Works Cited Page:

- Begin the list on a new page and continue numbering from paper.
- Center "Works Cited."
- Double space all lines.
- Arrange alphabetically by author last name.
- If no author is given, alphabetize by title (Ignore A, An, or The)
- Use "hanging indent" or indent the second and following lines 5 spaces.

*MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers*, 7th ed. New York: Modern Language Association, 2009. Print.

## Notes for Parenthetical or In-Text Citations:

- The parenthetical reference begins with the same name as the works cited entry. (ex. Koga 37-38).
- If citing only one work by an author, give only the author's last name and page number. (ex. Kobayashi 124-36).
- If citing one or several works by an author, give a short title after the author's name. (ex. Kobayashi, *Na Mea* 15-17)
- If the work is listed by title only, use the title or a shortened title but make sure to use the same first words as the works cited entry (ex. *Voice of the Shuttle* 23) not (*Shuttle* 23).

## CITATIONS FOR BIBLIOGRAPHY or WORKS CITED PAGE

### MLA Format

"References in the text must clearly point to the specific sources in the list of works cited" (MLA 214).

- A citation credits the source of your information.
- Whether you use a direct quotation enclosed in quotation marks or whether you paraphrase or summarize information, give credit to the source.
- Carefully follow the capitalization and punctuation marks in the examples below.
- *Italicize* titles of books, magazines.

### One Author:

Miller, Jonathan. *The Body in Question*. New York: Random House, 1978. Print.

### Two Authors:

McQuade, Walter, and Ann Aikman. *The Longevity Factor*. New York: Simon & Schuster, 1979. Print.

### More than 3:

Morris, Desmond, et al. *Gestures*. New York: Stein, 1979. Print.

**Editor:** Johnson, Stanley, ed. *The Population Problem*. New York: Wiley, 1973. Print.

## ENCYCLOPEDIA ARTICLES:

### Signed:

Duncan, F. Martin. "Hair." *Encyclopedia Britannica*. 1992 ed. Print.

### Unsigned:

"Hair-dressing." *Encyclopedia Americana*. 1977 ed. Print.

## MAGAZINE/PERIODICAL ARTICLES:

### Signed:

### Unsigned:

### Web Site:

1. List author or editor, if given.
2. "Title of document." (Usually the page or section)
3. Title of the overall Web site. (*Italicized*)
4. Date of publication. (ex. 10 May 2000 or n.d.)
5. Date accessed the website.
6. End with the <Website address or URL>.
